What: Gallery Exhibition: Santa Fe Legends – Jesse Nusbaum and Friends

As an anthropologist, archeologist and photographer, Jesse Nusbaum (1887-1975) is credited with preserving much of New Mexico's history and culture. He not only helped to excavate and preserve many prehistoric sites in the Southwest but also actively promoted the arts. Among his many accomplishments, he directed the remodeling of the Palace of the Governors on Santa Fe's Plaza, reconstructed the ceremonial kiva at Bandelier National Monument, was superintendent at Mesa Verde National Park, directed Santa Fe's Laboratory of Anthropology, was the senior archeologist of the National Park Service, helped to restore the mission church at Pecos, constructed fine furniture in the Craftsman/New Mexico Mission style and supervised the building of the Museum of Fine Arts in Santa Fe. His photographs were often used to document and promote the unique and diverse culture of the Southwest, appearing in magazine articles, postcards, world's fair publications, and railroad travel brochures. Even today, his photographs are continually reproduced and familiar to many locals and visitors alike.

When Owings-Dewey Fine Art opened it's new gallery on Nusbaum Street, it seemed appropriate to honor the man for whom the street was named. While Nusbaum did not consider himself a fine artist, his photographs display a sophistication of vision and sentiment and are a fitting backdrop for the paintings exhibited in the show. Included in the exhibition are many close friends and acquaintances of Nusbaum, all of whom directly or indirectly benefited from Nusbaum's involvement in the Santa Fe art scene.
